

3-C Questions: The Holy Spirit

1. **T** F The Gospels close, as they open, with the promise of the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. **Ref:** _____
- T** F The word '**Christ**' (Greek) and '**Messiah**' (Hebrew) both mean '**Anointed One**', & speak of **anointing with the Holy Spirit**. Jesus became Christ or Messiah when He was baptized in Holy Spirit at the Jordan River.
- T** F Prior to His infilling (baptism) with the Holy Spirit, Jesus **did not** and **could not** do any **miracles**.
- T** F Jesus instructions to His followers is that **BEFORE** they fulfill the Great Commission, that they **FIRST** be endued with Power through the Baptism in the Holy Spirit.
2. Jesus gave **two allegories** describing the presence of the **Holy Spirit** in a believer. **One** was that the Holy Spirit would be like a **well of water** within, welling up to eternal life. **What** is that reference? JOH 4:4-26 (13-14)
The Second is that of **rivers of living water** coming forth from our being. **What** is that reference? JOH 7:37-39
3. **These allegories** can be taken to represent **two aspects of salvation**, i.e. birth in or of the Spirit and the baptism in the Spirit. These 2 events in the life of a believer are represented by **two OT feasts**. The first is Passover (Pesach) and the second is Pentecost (Shavuot). **Are these simultaneous?** no
4. **Where** is the scripture passage describing the **nine GIFTS of the Spirit**? 1CO 12:1-11 Fill out the following table showing the three Categories of **Gifts of the Spirit** and the **three Gifts in each (Remember the Trinities in God's Creation?)**:

7. **ACT 10:38** how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. (NKJ)
ACT 2:38 Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call." (NKJ)
8. **When** did Jesus become '**Christ**'? when He was baptized in the Holy Spirit **What** does '**Christ**' mean? anointed one **When** was Jesus endued with **power**? After being tempted of the devil in the wilderness: (See **MAT 3:12-4:17; MAR 1:9-22; LUK 4:1-21, 32**) What is the **promised gift** referred to in **Q7**? The gift of the Holy Spirit (Holy Spirit Baptism) Is this gift available for **you** today? YES!
9. **GAL 3:13** Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"), 14 that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. (NKJ)
10. When **praying in tongues**, what part of your being prays? (**1CO 14:14**) my spirit, by the Holy Spirit within me
JUD 20 But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, (NKJ) **How can you build up your faith?** By praying in the Spirit
11. In the **OT consecration of the priest**, blood from a lamb was applied to the **right ear, thumb** and **great toe**, followed by putting oil on top of the blood. This represents initial salvation. Then rest of the oil was then poured onto the priest's head, which represents Spirit baptism. (**LEV 14:14-18**)

12. In the **OT meal offering**, the meal of fine flour was first baked with oil, which represents salvation. The bread was then broken apart and oil poured over the pieces, representing Holy Spirit baptism. The meal offering was only then fit for presentation God. (**LEV 2:5-6**) When do WE become fit for presentation in service to God? Only after we are born again and then filled with the Holy Spirit
13. On the **day of His resurrection**, Jesus breathed on His disciples, saying "receive the Holy Spirit" (**JOH 20:22**), but He later told His disciples to wait (10 days) in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit and power so they could be witnesses. (**ACT 1:4-5, 8**) **Why twice?** After His resurrection, the HS became available to indwell believer at salvation (He blew on them). Only at Pentecost could the be filled with the HS
14. **JOH 14:15** "If you love Me, keep My commandments. 16 "And (as a result of your obedience) I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper (**Comforter KJV**), that He may abide with you forever -- 17 the Spirit of Truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. (NKJ)
* **What is the Greek word** for **Helper** or **Comforter** in **JOH 14:15**? paracletos **What is the meaning** of this word? One who takes a hold of together with against
15. **IJO 2:1** My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. (NKJ)
* **What is the Greek word** for **advocate** here in **IJO 2:1**? paracletos
16. The Greek work **charisma** <5486> means gift. The root word **charis** <5485> means grace. Thus, a **charismatic** believes in and experiences grace gifts imparted by the Holy Spirit.
* **1CO 14:1** Pursue love, and desire spiritual gifts, but especially that you may prophecy.
2 For he who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God, for no one understands him; however, in the spirit he speaks mysteries. 3 But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men. (NKJ)
17. **ROM 11:29** For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. (NKJ) **What** is the Greek word for the first of these blanks? Gifts = charisma **What** is the **purpose** of the Gifts: **1CO 14:12** So it is with you. Since you are eager to have spiritual gifts, try to excel in gifts that build up the church. (NIV)
18. What does the word "**Christian**" mean? Little Christ or Christ-like **Where** were believers first called **Christians** (give ref.)? at Antioch ACTS 11:26 And when he (Barnabus) had found him (Paul), he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch. (NKJ)
19. **IJO 5:7** For there are three that bear witness in heaven: the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one. 8 And there are three that bear witness on earth: the Spirit, the water, and the blood; and these three agree as one. (NKJ)
20. **If Jesus** did not enter ministry until He was filled with the Holy Spirit, and told **His disciples** to wait until they were filled before attempting to fulfil Jesus' commission to them, **what does this mean to you?** I should be filled with the Holy Spirit before attempting to minister and witness in power or with any effectiveness
21. Write out **1CO 15:45**: And so it is written, "The first man Adam became a living soul." The last Adam became a life-giving spirit. (KJV) **Explain this scripture:** The reason the first Adam failed is that his life was based at the soul level. (psuchikos = natural man); The reason the Last Adam succeeded is that His Life was based on the Spirit of God within Him. (pneumatikos = Spiritual Man). First the natural, THEN the spiritual.
22. Read **GEN 15**. **How many were involved in making the covenant made with Abram?** **Who** are the **Smoking Furnace** and the **Burning Torch**? These represent the Father (Yahweh) and the Son (Yashua) who covenanted together to fulfill God's promise to redeem mankind from sin. The Son of God, Yashua, stood as representative of mankind, since He was to be incarnated as the Last Adam, and fulfill the promise of GEN 3:15 to become the Seed of the Woman as well as the Seed of Abreaham. Any covenant is only as strong as the parties that make it – so a covenant between the Father and the Son is UNBREAKABLE and ETERNAL!!!
23. Find **the Apostle's Creed** & and copy it here: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord: Who was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He arose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty, whence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
24. **What other 'Creeds' of the historic church** are there? The Nicene Creed, the Athanasian Creed, The Definition of Chalcedon, and The Anathemas of the Second Council of Constantinople (553 A.D.)
Which of these is **the oldest**? The Apostle's Creed **How do these creeds differ in describing the Trinity?** The Apostle's creed emphasizes the Father as God, who sends His Son, conceived by the Spirit, to redeem mankind from sin, but does NOT state that all three of the Trinity are equally God and separate and distinct personalities. Later creeds evolve to a belief in three separate and completely distinct personalities, all equally God in every way.
