4. **Praise** honors God for His deeds. **Worship** honors God for who He is.  
**Write out** a definition of **WORSHIP**: to pay extreme respect, honor, adoration, devotion, or homage to God through speech, song, lifestyle, gifts, physical acts, rites, or ceremonies.  
 Write out **MAT 4:10**: Then Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve.'"
5. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God by **BOWING DOWN or PROSTRATION**: DEU 9:18, 1KI 8:54, 2CH 6:13-14, EZR 9:5, DAN 6:10, PSA 95:6-7, MAT 2:11, EPH 3:14-15, PHI 2:9, REV 5:14, etc. JOB 1:20 Then Job arose, tore his robe, and shaved his head; and he fell to the ground and worshiped.
6. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God BY **CLAPPING or LIFTING HANDS**: PSA 47:1, PSA 98:8, ISA 55:12, 1KI 8:22-23, PSA 63:3-4, PSA 134:2-3, HAB 3:10, ITI 2:8, etc.
7. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God in **DANCE or SHOUTING**: ISA 18:6, 1CH 15:29, PSA 30:11-12, PSA 150:4-5, JOS 6:16, ISA 4:5, EZR 3:11, PSA 47:1, PSA 100:1, PSA 132:9, ISA 12:6, etc.
8. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God using **MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS**: ISA 16:23, 2SA 6:5, 1KI 10:12, 1CH 16:4-6, 42, 1CH 25:1, 2CH 29:25, PSA 30:11-12, PSA 150:4-5, LEV 25:9, JOS 6:4, PSA 98:6, HOS 5:8, PSA 147:7, ISA 23:16, ISA 5:12, EZR 3:10, NEH 12:27, etc.
9. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God in **PROPHECY**: 2KI 3:15-19, LUK 1:41-55, LUK 1:67-79, EXO 15:1-18, EXO 15:21, etc.
10. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God in **SONG**: PSA 68:4, PSA 69:30-31, PSA 77:6, PSA 89:1, PSA 95:1-2, PSA 98:1, PSA 126:2, PSA 137:3-4, ISA 35:10, ISA 52:8-9, etc.
11. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God in or by **THE SPIRIT**: JOH 4:23-24, ACT 3:19, ROM 8:6-8, ROM 12:1-2, 1CO 2:14, 1CO 12:13, 1CO 14:26, EPH 5:18-20, PHI 3:3, COL 3:16, HEB 9:14, HEB 10:3-4, HEB 10:19-20, HEB 13:15-16, JUD 20, 1PE 2:5, etc
12. Give **scripture examples** of praise & worship of God in His **TEMPLE or TABERNACLE**: PSA 100, EXO 25:22, JER 7:1-2, JER 26:2, JOH 4:20-24, PSA 5:7, PSA 103:1, PSA 138:2, PSA 150:1, ZEC 14:20-21, 1CO 3:16-17, EPH 2:21-22, REV 11:1, etc.
13. Write out **1CO 14:26**: How is it then, brethren? Whenever you come together, each of you has a psalm, has a teaching, has a tongue, has a revelation, has an interpretation. Let all things be done for edification. (NKJ)  
 Write out **PHI 3:3**: For we are the circumcision, who worship God in the Spirit, rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh, (NKJ)
14. **EPH 5:18** And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, 19 speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, 20 giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 submitting to one another in the fear of God. (NKJ)  
**What** is the difference in **psalms**, **hymns**, and **spiritual songs**? Psalms are inspired utterances in song or Prose, given by the Spirit. Hymns are known songs sung in praise and worship. Spiritual Songs are sung As inspired and given by the Spirit, either 'new' for the first time, or given previously by the Spirit.  
 Write out **JUDE 20**: But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, (NKJ)
15. What is a **'Tallit'**? The Jewish prayer shawl, given to a male at his Bar Mitzvah, marking his entry into the religious community, and his age of accountability to the Law of Moses.  
**What** does the name mean? The Hebrew means 'little tent', in contrast to the 'big tent' of the Tabernacle in the Wilderness. **Name** someone in the NT that made Tallits for a living: Paul (ACT 18:1-3)  
 What was Elijah's **mantle** that contained his power? His Tallit: 1KI 19:11-13, 1KI 19:19, 2KI 2:8-15  
 What was the **'napkin'** the Lord's head (& Lazarus!) was wrapped in at His burial? JOH 11:43-44, 20:6-8  
**What** was the garment and fringe that the woman with hemorrhage for 12 years touched and received her healing? (MAT 9:20-22, MAT 14:35-36, MAR 6:56, LUK 8:43-48) She probably knew the OT promise about the Messiah, MAL 4:2-3, that the son of Righteousness would come with healing in His 'wings'. The part of the Tallit draped over the shoulders and having the tzit tzit's (tassels) are called 'wings'. She said to herself, "if I but touch the hem of His garment (His Tallit), I will be made whole." She did so, and was immediately healed.

16. **DEU 30:6** “And the Lord your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your descendants, to love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, that you may live. (NKJ)
- ROM 2:28** For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh; 29 but he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the Spirit, not in the letter; whose praise is not from men but from God. (NKJ)
17. **COL 2:11** In Him (Christ) you were also circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the sins of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, 12 buried with Him in baptism, in which you also were raised with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead. (NKJ)

**Christ**, as the anointing of the spirit, circumcises our heart to cut **OFF** the flesh, to transform us into **HIS** likeness and glory, **AS** we spend time in His ‘operating room’ of worship. Thanksgiving gets us in through the gate of His Tabernacle, Praise brings us into His courts. The **Brazen Altar**, representing the Blood of the Sacrifice, and the **Brazen Laver**, representing the Washing of the Word, bring us through the outer court, and usher us into the Holy Place. Within the Holy Place are the **Menorah**, representing the Light of the Spirit, the **Table of Shewbread**, representing the Word as the Bread of Life, and the **Altar of incense**, representing Prayer, usher us up to the **Veil**, which is the Body of Christ. We pass through His Body, torn for us, and enter the **Holy of Holies**, beholding the **Ark of the Covenant**. What is His covenant (‘to cut’) with us? To take away our sins. He circumcises our very hearts within the Holy of Holies, by writing the Law of God on our hearts by the Holy Spirit. The Ark represents Christ. Within the Ark are found the **Stone Tablets of the Law**, a **Jar of Manna**, and **Aaron’s Rod** that Budded. On the top of the Ark is the **Mercy Seat**, overshadowed by the **wings of the two Cherubim**. There we meet God, who changes us into **HIS VERY IMAGE**.

18. **After** being in God’s presence on Mount Sinai, his face shone with so much of God’s glory that the Israelites could not bear to look at him. He was transformed into God’s likeness. **How** does this principle apply to you and I as we spend time in praise and worship of God? The more time we spend in prayer, praise & worship of God, the more WE will be changed into His likeness. The change happens in His PRESENCE, within the Holy of Holies. THAT is where the FIRE refines us like silver, like gold.
19. **1CO 3:16** Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? 17 If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are. (NKJ)
- EPH 2:21** in whom (Christ) the whole building, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, 22 in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit. (NKJ)
20. **Find** the scripture where Elisha asked for a **minstrel** to play. **What** happened? 2KI 3:14-20 When the minstrel played, the ‘hand of the LORD’ (the Spirit of God) came upon Elisha, and he prophesied victory. Could this have application for today? PSA 22:3 states that God inhabits or is enthroned in the praises of His people. PSA 65:1 states the Praise is ‘waiting of God’ – for Him to act. In the story of Jehosophat, God acted on Israel’s behalf and destroyed their enemies WHILE they praised and worshipped. These SAME principles apply today – God often acts as we praise and worship, with healing, a touch of the Spirit, etc. Where is the scripture describing Saul’s relief from an evil spirit when David played his Harp in praise and worship to God? ISA 16:23 And so it was, whenever the spirit from God was upon Saul, that David would take a harp and play it with his hand. Then Saul would become refreshed and well, and the distressing spirit would depart from him.
21. **Who** was God’s original **worship leader**? Give scripture support: Lucifer. EZE 28:11-19, ISA 14:12-20, What happened to Him? Give Scripture: LUK 10:18 And He said to them, “I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. EZE 28:16 “By the abundance of your trading You became filled with violence within, And you sinned; Therefore I cast you as a profane thing Out of the mountain of God; And I destroyed you, O covering cherub, From the midst of the fiery stones. (also ISA 14:12)
22. **MAR 12:30** And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, & with all your strength. This is the first commandment.(NKJ)
- What** are the three parts of your being represented here in love of God (see **1TH 5:23**)? Spirit (heart – includes conscience, intuition, and spiritual communion), soul (mind, will, emotions), and body (strength).
23. **Explain** how this principle applies to praise and worship of God with all of our **heart (spirit man)**, **soul**, and **strength (physical body)**: We are triune beings – spirit, soul & body. God desires that we praise, honor, and worship Him with all aspects of our being.
24. **When** you begin to thank, praise, and worship God, with **what** part do you begin? I begin in the outer court, (my body), entering the gate with thanksgiving, and into the court with praise. I lift my hands, speak with my lips, sing, clap, shout, kneel, bow down, prostrate myself before God, playing musical instruments, dance, etc. From the outer court I enter the Holy Place, where God’s Spirit illuminates His Word and inspires prayer. Only then do I pass through the veil into the Holy of Holies, to the Ark and the presence of God in His Spirit. How does the phrase ‘priming the pump’ relate to praise & worship? The old farm hand pumps had to be ‘primed’ with water before they would pump water. ‘You had to put something in before you could get something out.’ The SAME is true for Praise & Worship – We START the process by putting something in, in the NATURAL; then God responds with His ‘living water’, the Holy Spirit, from the well of life. What is ‘doing carpet time’ in praise & worship? To kneel, bow down, or to prostrate myself before God in humility, in contriteness, in order to worship and to wait upon the LORD.
25. **How** will you apply what you have learned in this lesson to your life? Answer for yourself.
