

MC550: Ministries of Healing and Deliverance (4 units)
C. Peter Wagner, Professor of Church Growth

DESCRIPTION:

A ministry-oriented course intending to help students discover and understand assumptions concerning the relevance of God's power in miraculous healing (including demonic deliverance) and to develop skills for applying it to the local church as to the contemporary task of world evangelization. Doris Wagner shares extensive expertise on casting our demons as a part of the course.

This is a **one-week intensive** course. Classes meet daily from 8:30 a.m. - 3:50 p.m., December 14-18, 1998.
