

# **CLONING AGAIN... AND AGAIN... AND AGAIN**

More than three years ago, I sent out a first piece about cloning, in the wake of the announcement of the cloning of a sheep named Dolly. At the time it was claimed that there was no possibility of going on to practice the cloning of human beings. I wrote then that I believed that this was nonsense, and that I was in no doubt that we were being gradually desensitized to the idea of human cloning. A classic form of infiltration of an unacceptable idea is by drip feeding. As the introduction of an idea takes place stealthily, step-by-step, those who are opposed will be silenced as the majority are gradually brought into submissive acceptance, without them realising that they have been conned by an age-old strategy. This is why sodomy has now come to receive global acceptance and official promotion, even in the Church.

But make no mistake, the eventual acceptance of human cloning (which is inevitably going to be part of the climax of the "mystery of iniquity") will make the evil of sodomy seem like a chimpanzees' tea party. Although we are told that it is to aid medical science and the treatment of diseases that a limited form of human cloning must go ahead, that altruistic spin is merely a cloak for the real intentions behind cloning.

On August 14th 2000, it was announced in the UK that :-

<"MPs will be given a free vote this autumn on whether scientists should be allowed limited rights to clone human embryos for medical research. Tony Blair will give the Commons a chance to give its verdict on Government-backed recommendations that are expected to provoke an outcry from right-to-life campaigners. Ministers are set to endorse the advice of Prof Liam Donaldson, the Chief Medical Officer for England, who will report on Wednesday in favour of cloning embryos to produce "stem cells" for therapeutic purposes" [Daily Telegraph, 14th August 2000].>

You see here that in complete opposition to all the remarks about restraint a few years ago, the Chief Medical Officer of England is now in favour of cloning embryos. This is all going to happen folks. Believe me, we are on the cusp of a Brave New World which even Aldous Huxley could not have dreamed up in one of his LSD-induced fantasies. The chief architect of the human fertilisation and embryology laws for the English government is the so-called "moral philosopher" Baroness Mary Warnock. Campaigner for the handicapped, Peter Brawley, said recently in an article on "Disability Net" that "Warnock actively promotes abortion and involuntary euthanasia to get rid of disabled people. Because of her status, she has real power over our lives".

In an interview of Warnock by Marry Riddell in the "New Statesman" on 25 October 1996, it was said of Warnock: "Years ago, she told me, her father-in-law - a doctor - used to smother at birth hopelessly handicapped babies. She mourns the loss of such practices. "That was right. Doctors were bold enough to take decisions but now it all has to be so co-operative"."

In an article in the Daily Telegraph on January 31st 1999, Dr James Le Fanu, leading MD in the UK and author of "The Rise & Fall of Modern Medicine" (Little, Brown & Co., 1999, 400pp.), said regarding some remarks made by Warnock justifying her views on human embryo experimentation: "Either the Baroness is so dim she does not realise the rottenness of her philosophy, or she and her committee deliberately sought to make experiments on human embryos acceptable by invoking misleading philosophical arguments. Either way, 15 years on the fruits of such experiments are nugatory, while public morality has been further debased by the endorsement, through parliamentary legislation, of the principle that moral considerations of any sort should not be allowed to stand in the way of the pursuit of science".

Baroness Warnock and her type of "moral philosophers" (cf. 1 Cor.1:18-20) are among the most dangerous people on the planet today. And that's before we've even started to look at the connection here with the massive outbreak of alleged encounters with Space Aliens and sightings of UFOs! Everyone is aware of the publicity given to the successful cloning of a sheep in Scotland. I don't pretend to have any specialist genetic knowledge on this, so I may be out of line in my thinking here; but from my limited knowledge of Scripture (not to mention what light I have from nature) I would surely say that we are heading into some pretty hairy territory with this one.

It is bad enough to clone a sheep; but sheep don't have souls (at least, that's how I read the Bible on this subject, but that's the subject of a separate article), so cloning a sheep surely doesn't carry the same dire spiritual problems as cloning a human being, because normal un-cloned human beings do have souls. Would I be right in thinking that a cloned human being could not possibly have a soul as it has not been brought into being through a sperm and egg conjunction in the line of Adam, but merely through "growing" genetic matter as an experiment carried out in a human laboratory? A soul-less clone would, therefore, be ripe pickings for inhabitation by demonic forces -- what New Agers call "walk-ins". If this is the case, then surely a cloned human being without a soul would be a grotesque monstrosity which brings us right into the kind of nightmare Nephilim scene we find in Genesis 6:1-4.

## **Questions:**

- 1) Could all this cloning news be connected up with what the pseudo-aliens are involved in through their demonic abductions, when they often perform experiments on the reproductive organs of abductees and extract ova and semen?
- 2) On the basis that what one hears about is only the tip of an iceberg, do you think it possible that in spite of only being presented so far with a sheep cloning, human clonings have already been carried out secretly, perhaps even en masse?
- 3) Is it not the case that caveats are rarely heeded in the scientific world, especially once momentum has begun in earnest in any given area -- especially one such as this, which would be so helpful to the realisation of the New World Order?

You may wonder how human cloning could dovetail with the alien abduction thing. It goes like this: The spiritual battle is shaping up so that all is in preparation for the coming World Teacher (which true Christians would identify as the Antichrist). This is the Big Plan. I am increasingly convinced that this heinous event could be sooner than we may think. In order for the Big Plan to come to fruition quickly it is necessary for the demonic realm to wield as much influence as possible in those spheres of human activity where it can be most effective -- government, education, the media, etc. Demons have had Divine limitations placed on them from the time of the Ascension of Christ. This is why Satan has had to give the beast government (which culminates in the Antichrist) "his power, his throne, and great authority" (Rev.13:2). The demonic realm manipulates human development and behaviour through human agencies. However, demons (being angels) cannot reproduce among themselves. Could this be the reason why they have been taking ova and other reproductive material from women who have been abducted by them when they are posing as "aliens"? Are these pseudo-aliens attempting to clone human creatures for their own demonic ends (i.e., a massive infiltration of key human positions by "walk-ins" and possessed beings)? Could it be that human cloning has already taken place on a large scale, but we are being "drip fed" the information so as to gradually acclimatize us to their dastardly machinations? Could it be that cloning technology -- and the entire body of knowledge about genetic engineering -- has been passed to humans by the pseudo-alien hive?

If you think all this is far fetched, is it not extraordinary that in January 1997, just three days after I said that the human cloning thing "dovetails with what the pseudo-aliens are doing", the following article should appear in the Sunday Telegraph here in the U.K.:

**SWISS CULT BACKS BABY CLONE DOCTOR** By Victoria Macdonald, Health Correspondent

A SWISS-based religious cult has offered an American physicist money and support for his plans to clone children for infertile couples. A spokesman for the Raelian Movement claimed that representatives would meet Dr Richard Seed this week after speaking to him on Friday. Dr Seed caused consternation last week by claiming that he would have a cloned human developing inside a womb by mid-1999.

The Raelian Movement has established a company called Valiant Venture to provide a "Clonaid" service. The cult believes that life was created scientifically in laboratories by extra-terrestrials and that there is, therefore, no moral or ethical question that humans should not be cloned. Valiant Venture was set up in the Bahamas where there are no anti-cloning laws, but the cult claims to have sub-contracted laboratories around the world to carry out experiments.

Dr Brigitte Boisselier, a spokesman for the cult, told The Telegraph that 100 infertile and homosexual couples have signed up for the cloning which will cost £130,000. Dr Boisselier also claimed that it would cost £1.3 million to complete experiments leading to baby cloning. She said private investors had provided some of the money and the movement would be prepared to use at least part of this to back Dr Seed's work.

Dr Seed believes that human cloning can be developed using the techniques which led to the creation of Dolly the Sheep. The Chicago-based scientist, who describes himself as a God-fearing Methodist, said: "Cloning and the reprogramming of DNA is the first serious step in becoming one with God."

Dr Ian Wilmut, the British embryologist who cloned Dolly, said Dr Seed was heading down a "dangerous" road. "To produce Dolly we had to use 277 embryos. A quarter of the lambs died within a few days because of underdevelopment. Lambs are one thing, but it could be worse with humans."

Friends, the above article did not appear in the "Fortean Times" or "Nexus" futurological magazines. The Sunday Telegraph is one of the leading quality newspapers in the U.K. The Raelian Movement has been known to me for many years. In 1994, in my book "The Serpent and the Cross" (p.178), I wrote:-

<"On 2nd December 1993, a quarter-page advertisement was placed on p.7 in the International Herald Tribune, by a French journalist who claims that ETs took him to their planet, gave him the name of Raël, asking him to spread the message that these beings will soon come back to earth, and that an embassy must be built for the occasion. Do not be surprised to find such reports increasing in the future">

And so they have! On Wednesday 11th October 2000, an article appeared in the "Daily Express" -- a fairly conservative UK newspaper -- outlining the latest plans of the Raelian cult:

**CULT IN FIRST BID TO CLONE HUMAN**  
**BY TOBY MOORE IN NEW YORK AND MICHAEL HANLON IN LONDON**

A BIZARRE religious cult is to try to produce the world's first human clone by "re-creating" a dead girl. An American couple have paid £300,000 to the cult's scientists following the death of their 10-month-old daughter. Work will start this month on cells the couple preserved after the child died in what is being described as a medical accident. Yesterday controversy raged over the ethics of the plan. British cloning expert Prof Ian Wilmut, who created Dolly the Sheep, said: "*It is absolutely criminal to try this in a human.*"

The Rael cult believes cloning is the key to "eternal life" and claims humans were cloned from aliens. At a press conference in Canada it announced that up to 50 surrogate mothers had volunteered to carry cloned human embryos in their wombs. Dr Brigitte Boisselier, scientific director of the Raelians, which claims 50,000 members in 85 countries, said: "We've got the funding. We anticipate being able to start in October." The Raelian cult founded by Claude Vorilhon, a 53-year-old French former sportswriter, has already set up Clonaid, a Bahamas company to produce babies for homosexual couples. Its laboratory is reported to be in a Third World country where human cloning is not illegal. Rael told the press conference in a Montreal hotel, at which he was surrounded by some of the surrogate mothers, that the mother of the child who died would not be amongst them. If the pregnancy failed, he said, she would not have to endure "losing the same child again."

The Raelians offered no proof that they had any of the medical skills required to clone, but they last year stated their ambition to make it happen and, according to impartial scientists, there is no longer any technical reason why they should not succeed. The Raelian cult has been at the forefront of the informal race to produce a cloned child. Boisselier did not identify the American couple who have put up the money to produce a clone of their 10-month-old daughter from her cells. Neither did she identify the team who will work on the task.

But the announcement in Montreal, last month, is being treated seriously by academics with no interest in the stranger aspects of the Rael religion. Lee Silver, a Princeton University biologist and authority of cloning techniques, said: "Just like the Aum Shinrikyo religious group, which recruited highly trained chemists to develop nerve gas for their attack on a Tokyo subway train, I bet that the Raelians could find the highly trained people they would need to carry out human cloning. "I get letters all the time from people who want to be cloned. I have no doubt it will happen very soon."

"People with experience in vitro fertilisation would probably be able to do it," said Michael West, chief executive of Advanced Cell Technology, in Massachusetts. His company has been cloning human embryo cells in the hope of developing medical treatments. "The directions are all in the scientific literature. They're not top secret." Experts believe that the biggest obstacle to human cloning is not that it requires particularly complex technical ability, but that it would take many failed pregnancies to achieve a success. There is also political unease over the process, which is why human cloning is banned in 19 countries, though not the United States.

"It's a numbers game," said George Seidel, a cloning expert at Colorado University. "It's very likely that if you did it enough times you could make it work." Scientists generally agree that 20 human egg donors and 50 surrogate mothers offer the probability of making a human clone. But leading genetics experts condemned the plan. Prof Ian Wilmut, the man who created Dolly the Sheep at the Roslin Institute near Edinburgh condemned the plan. "It sounds to me like a very misguided exercise," he said. "Clearly everybody feels very sorry for any couple who loses a child but you cannot get that child back. People should realise that as a biological truth. "Quite apart from that, it is absolutely criminal to try this in a human."

Dr Vivienne Nathanson, head of ethics at the British Medical Association said the cloning bid could cause a public outcry. "They may succeed and if they do it will be very interesting," she said. "But rather than winning a Nobel Prize these people may have to face almost universal condemnation. "There's a fairly broad consensus worldwide that this is undesirable. It's too risky and underpinning the scientific risk there are tremendous moral and ethical problems. I'm not convinced that people understand how unsafe the science is."

Professor Robert Winston, the test tube baby pioneer, said that cloning technology was so new that it would be very unlikely to produce a healthy baby. "As they are so extremely unlikely to succeed I hardly feel the need to raise my voice to condemn them," he said.

Cloning involves producing a genetic twin from a single cell, for example a skin cell. Cattle, mice and pigs have all been cloned since the birth of Dolly the sheep in Scotland in 1996. Dolly was the first mammal ever cloned from an adult. The biggest obstacle to creating a human clone is obtaining a supply of eggs. A scientist wishing to clone a person would need dozens of healthy human eggs - meaning that several women would have to be paid to have their ovaries stimulated with hormones - a painful and potentially dangerous process. Once harvested, the eggs are then denucleated - their DNA is removed using a fine syringe. DNA extracted from cells from the individual to be cloned is then injected into the egg. The fusion of DNA and egg is then stimulated using chemicals or an electric jolt. The growing embryo is cultivated in the lab until it is big enough to be implanted into the womb.

Cloning in animals is a hit-and-miss affair. Hundreds of sheep eggs were injected to produce Dolly, although the cloning success rate has been improving in the years since. Even if an egg can be made to divide, it will not always grow into an embryo that can be implanted. And a large number of cloning pregnancies in sheep, cows and mice end in failure - either by miscarriage or the death of the newborn shortly after birth. Cloned animals tend to be larger than normal, and this can lead to developmental problems.

But there is no evidence that a healthy clone is any different to a "normal" animal. There were fears that Dolly was ageing faster than normal - she had been cloned from a six-year-old ewe - but these fears appear to be unfounded. THE Raelians' sinister tentacles stretch across the Atlantic and into Britain, experts say.

Graham Baldwin, director of Catalyst, a British charity which helps people damaged by cults, described the Rael movement as "very dangerous" and with huge financial assets, including £15million in one Swiss bank account alone. "What is so worrying is that the man behind it believes he is not answerable to any rules or rulers," he added. "It's these people who end up doing terrible things to their supporters." The organisation, which describes itself as "the world's largest UFO related, non-profit organisation" was founded by a French racing driver and journalist named Claude Vorilhon, who says he had an erotic encounter with aliens in 1973. Now calling himself Rael, he lives in Canada and teaches that life on Earth was created some 25,000 years ago with DNA imported by aliens. He thinks that human cloning is the way to eternal life. His beliefs, which are big on free sex and spontaneous nudity, have not surprisingly drawn about 50,000 members in 85 countries. Most are in Quebec.

Commentators have noted the high number of attractive people the cult seems to attract, usually between the ages of 17 and 28. Rael recently began racing cars again, but has denied that the 25 women who regularly travel with him to races are a harem. He says they are his public relations executives. His "religion" has 125 priests and 24 bishops, and Rael lives in a home near Montreal which houses UFOland, a theme park. The star exhibit is a full-size model of the space ship he says he boarded for his erotic encounter with "the eternal". But however absurd the cult may seem, its aim to produce a cloned human and its huge resources lend its pronouncements some credibility.

The scientific arm of the religion is Clonaid, set up to help infertile and homosexual couples have children. Valiant Ventures, also based in the Bahamas, promises to help parents produce a clone of one of them. A third offshoot,

Clonapet is offering to recreate dogs and cats and champion race horses. It is not Rael or his weird beliefs that interest those most concerned about the ethics of cloning. They mainly fear the head of his scientific operations and a bishop in his church, Dr Brigitte Boisselier. She is unabashed in her determination to move the process forward.

She said recently: "I'm a scientist and very pragmatic even if I do believe in little green men." Graham Baldwin said that contacts with people who had left the religion found them disturbed by their experience. "The general feeling is that he produces a nervous dependency, taking away their freedom." He said Rael was dangerous because his claims about meetings with aliens lulled authorities across the world into assuming he was just a joke figure. "The idea that they will clone a human is very credible because they seem to have the ambition and vast amounts of money. The mistake is that people have not taken Rael seriously."

All this is now coming together. It often happens that establishment figures are very content to sit back and let apparent loonies do their dirty work for them. "Useful idiots", as Lenin called them.

Again, in "The Serpent and the Cross" in 1994, on the subject of cloning, I wrote: <<"The key threshold in this area was crossed in October 1993, when it was reported to the American Fertility Society in Montreal that an experiment had occurred in which two scientists at George Washington University had successfully cloned human embryos - producing forty-eight clones from just seventeen microscopic embryos. The first recorded animal cloning took place as early as 1952 when frogs were cloned from tadpoles; but agricultural researchers had used such a cloning technique for more than a decade before the George Washington University experiment. However, this was the first time that it had been used for human cloning. Although the practice of cloning is outlawed in Germany, Japan and the United Kingdom, it is only a matter of time before the work in the U.S. is reproduced across the world. What will happen then is anybody's guess. As one reporter has put it: 'Technology tends to develop a momentum of its own'.

The reason for this huge upsurge of work in these taboo areas (in which humanists just love to trample) is not too difficult to understand. As the forces of evil have gathered increasingly in momentum and intensity, so all the multifarious (and often seemingly disparate) factions of antichristian origin will make their own idiosyncratic contribution to the process of world apostasy and accumulated evil. Is it not a fact that "Wherever the carcass is, there the eagles will be gathered together"? (Mt.24:28).">>

What is it that we are creating in a clone? When I wrote about this last year in an e-mail message, I said that I believed it is quite possible (and even likely) that a clone will be without a soul. I received some considerable criticism for that remark; but I stand by it even today. If the "alien hive" (i.e. demonic realm) is creating beings for its evil work they will effectively be "walk-ins". We're talking about some kind of mutants here (aren't we back to the Nephilim of Gen.6:1-4?). I strongly believe (along with Tertullian, the Lutherans and W.G.T. Shedd, etc.) in the Traducianist theory of the origin of the soul -- that the soul comes through generation in the same manner as the body, through man and woman becoming "one flesh" (male sperm and female egg fusion) and subsequently conceiving. Many adhere to a "creationist" theory of the origin of the soul -- that God creates a fresh soul for each body. But I cannot accept that, for the following reasons: God only breathed the "breath of life" into Adam and no one after him. The Lord "rested" on the seventh day and finished His work of creation ex nihilo. When Adam became a father, the child was conceived in the image of Adam rather than the image of God (Gen.5:3). Furthermore, if God creates a soul afresh for each new being, how can we account for original sin, whereby "in Adam, all die" (1 Cor.15:22) and "all sinned" in Adam (Rom.5:12). We cannot accuse God of creating sinful souls. I am, therefore, a convinced Traducian. The Traducian concept means that a normal human soul is the product of the coming together of a sperm and an egg -- that somewhere in the process of reproduction a male sperm has been involved as well as a female ovum. This is part of the Divine creation mandate: "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh" (Gen.2:24). Cloning is a heinous violation of this process, and I therefore believe it is highly likely that these beings -- whether manufactured by "aliens" (i.e. demons) from another dimension or by mad scientists in a laboratory -- will be soulless creatures ready to be inhabited by demonic entities. We are now entering uncharted territory whereby the human race has embarked on the ultimate denial of God, and, indeed, the usurpation of His Divine role. We will then be one step away from the Antichrist, who will surely be the fitting culmination of all this. On that point, it is no coincidence that Fox News in the USA on Wednesday October 11th ] ( [http://www.foxnews.com/etcetera/101100/second\\_coming.sml](http://www.foxnews.com/etcetera/101100/second_coming.sml) ) reported a plan by a group called "The Second Coming Project" ( <http://www.clonejesus.com> ) to make a human clone from some DNA allegedly belonging to Jesus Christ. The report stated: "The group hopes a cloned Jesus fetus could be placed in a female volunteer's womb and then carried to term in a totally immaculate conception. The birth is tentatively scheduled for Dec. 25, 2001, and the mother wouldn't necessarily have to be a virgin, the source said. Once born, the baby Jesus clone would be like any other kid, Savior of Mankind or not. Except that -- one hopes -- he'd usher in an age of Peace on Earth". Well you you can make what you will of that bizarre piece of hokum -- but it certainly captures the spirit of the age!

Information is being presented to the public on a "drip-drip" basis so that the unthinkable eventually becomes the acceptable through a carefully worked-out step-by-step occult process. Do you imagine that it is a coincidence that the Roslin Institute, which cloned Dolly the sheep, is situated adjacent to one of the main world centres of Freemasonry and modern gnosticism -- Rosslyn Chapel. I'd better quit here, or you'll be kitting out that rubber room for me again!
